In addition to teaching private apprentices, Katja founded an herb school in Boston which offers community drop in classes, a 9-month community herbalism apprenticeship, and a three-year intensive training program for clinical herbalism. In 2016, the online program launched and as of 2017, the full clinical training program is available online as a video program with live mentorship. Katja also teaches advanced disaster response and post-disaster community health programs, as well as business programs for herbalists and other holistic practitioners starting their own practices.
